

A Message from Pastor Aanonson:

IT'S FREE! IT'S FREE! IT'S FREE! God's gift of grace given to us through His Son Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior is free! Lutherans are very fond of saying that we are justified (saved) by grace through faith. What we need to remember is that we do not put a comma after the word "faith"; there is a period there. It is so easy to want to add other words after "faith" so that it reads something like "we are justified by grace though faith, but we have to....." And then we take it away. We proclaim that God's gift is given and we take it away by making it something that we have earned by what we do. A few months ago I was channel surfing and ran across a local preacher who was explaining that we are saved by grace through faith, which was God's free gift, but we had to make a decision for Jesus Christ, believe in Jesus Christ, confess our sins, and he added a couple of other thing that I don't remember. By the time he was done with the "add-ons" I was beginning to despair. Thankfully, he was very wrong in what he was saying. He was taking the gospel and making it law. In reality he was declaring that we were saved by the law, by what we do; not by what God did and does. The law (what we do) was ultimate and God's grace was penultimate. It was like God putting His grace on a plate on the table and we had to reach for it and grab it off the plate for us to have it. Those very actions of reaching and grabbing (decisions) make those actions ultimate and God's grace penultimate.

Martin Luther read 1 Corinthians 12:3, *Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says "Jesus be cursed!" and no one can say "Jesus is Lord" except by the Holy Spirit.* Later as he wrote in his *Small Catechism* the explanation to the Third Article of the Apostles' Creed we hear the echo of these words, *I believe that by my own reason or strength I cannot believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him. But the Holy Spirit has called me through the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, and sanctified and preserved me in the true faith....* Luther frankly admits that he cannot believe that Jesus Christ is his Lord. Luther cannot make a decision to believe. As sinful human beings we are incapable to making any decisions other than the decision to continue our unbelief. It takes God Himself through the Holy Spirit to break through our sin and speak the words of belief. The decision is never our decision; it is always God's decision. In John 15:16 we hear Jesus tells His disciples, *You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you....* What was true then is true today. We are incapable of choosing God, but God in His love chose us and continues to choose us everyday to be His. In the end we do not have that which we prize so much, free will. Luther reminds us that only God and God alone has a free will. Do you see the trap set by so many of us of once again focusing on ourselves and putting God once again in

second place (the penultimate place)? The glorious proclamation of the Gospel is always, but always what God does. It is not what we do or have to do or better do. It is always what God has done, is doing, and will do for us through His Son Jesus Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit.

IT'S COSTLY! IT'S COSTLY! IT'S COSTLY! In His free will God has chosen to bind Himself to His creation. God's free gift of grace is not free. Dietrich Bonhoeffer reminds us that what is His free gift to us is very costly to God. It cost God the life of His Son Jesus Christ. God's free will, God's free costly choice was to save His creation through the death of His Son on the cross. There are no ifs, and, or buts after God's declaration of grace to us. But we are changed. God's grace changes us. God's Holy Spirit works in us daily to bring us to repentance of our sin and to raise us up to be new people, new people who are conformed to Christ. The work of the Holy Spirit is day by day to make us into people who fear, love, and trust in God above all things. That too is God's work. For all this Luther says we are to thank, praise, serve, and obey our Lord (And that too is the work of the Holy Spirit. Thanks be to God!)

In Celebration of Graduation

Daring to Dream

Every day Taw Kaw Htoo pursues her dreams as a farmer, a child care provider and an English student. After fleeing violence and persecution in her native Burma, Taw Kaw Htoo lived in refugee camps in Thailand before being resettled to the U.S. She may have lost her home, but not her hope. With LSI's support, this strong, courageous woman is daring to dream.

Her day begins at dawn at LSI's Global Greens Farm where she farms a small plot, growing produce to sell to her community.

"I like farming because I grew vegetables back in my home country," she said.

After tending her crops, she moves on to her second business of the day: caring for children. LSI's child care business development program helps former refugees become state-licensed child care providers. Along with providing a small income, the program increases the availability of culturally appropriate child care for the refugee community, enabling more parents to enter the workforce.

"I didn't have any professional training on how to install a car seat or do CPR," said Taw Kaw Htoo. "LSI has helped with that. It's great that I am able to care for the children in my community."

Caring for children helps her pursue her third dream: learning English.

"My language is really important to me," she said. "I try to teach children my language every day, and they help me learn English. I really want to speak English. That's my biggest dream."
