My name is David A. Aanonson and I am the interim pastor of Grace Lutheran Church for the next few months. I retired approximately four and a half years ago after thirty-five years of fulltime ministry. I was born and raised around Estherville, Iowa, and graduated from Lincoln Central High School in Gruver, Iowa (It really is on the Iowa highway map.) I grew up on a farm. We were dairy farmers for a good part of that time. My father later both farmed and had a service station in town. So, I spent much time filling cars with gas and washing them. I attended Augsburg College, Minneapolis; Estherville Junior College; and graduated from Dana College, Blair, Nebraska, in 1968 with a B. A. in history and social science. It was at Dana College that I met my wife, Barbara, and we were married in 1969. Barb graduated that year with a B. S. in elementary education. I was in the United States Air Force from 1968 to 1972 as a radio intercept analyst. I was stationed in Amarillo and San Angelo, Texas, Brindisi, Italy, and Anchorage, Alaska. Barb was able to accompany me to both Italy and Alaska. After I was discharged from the Air Force, I attended Northwestern Lutheran Theological Seminary, St. Paul, Minnesota. I served my year of internship at Central Lutheran Church, Regina, Saskatchewan, Canada. I received a Master of Divinity degree in 1976. Since I was ordained I have served the following congregations: First-Chariton and Christ the Servant-Corydon, Iowa; All Saints-Davenport (of which I was the pastor developer); Mamrelund-Stanton, Iowa; Trinity-Lawrence, Kansas; and Christ the King-Iowa City (from which I retired after twenty years). While we lived in Lawrence I also attended the University of Kansas and earned a Master of Business of Administration. Since retirement I have served as the interim pastor at the following congregations: First-Cedar Rapids, Holy Redeemer-Cedar Rapids, and Faith and Our Savior's-Calamus. Barb and I are parents of three children: Rachel (and husband Eric) of Vinton, Iowa; Erik (and wife Wendy) of Bondurant, Iowa, and Sarah of North Liberty. We are also grandparents of six delightful grandchildren. Barb worked at Grant Wood Area Education Agency for over twenty years and now occasionally substitutes at Iowa City Montessori School (She earlier taught fulltime at Anchorage Montessori School). I look forward to serving as your pastor for the next few months. We will continue to live in Coralville and I will commute to serve you. I do ask for your prayers and

**CALL COMMITTEE UPDATE:**

The members met with, and were trained by, Pr. Ostrem on August 11<sup>th</sup>. John Simmons was elected Chair. The members were then installed the following Sunday, August 16<sup>th</sup>, by Pr. Marvin Mueller. Each member was assigned a section of the multi-page Ministry Site Profile to complete before their next meeting of September 8<sup>th</sup>. In the bulletins of August 23<sup>rd</sup> and August 30<sup>th</sup>, the Call Committee will be asking short and simple questions of the Congregation concerning the next called Pastor. These answers will be used as guidelines for the Call Committee. A 75 word statement about the church also is required from the Call Committee.

**TREASURER’S REPORT:**

The money for the air-conditioner is in the \$61,000.00 range, which is enough to pay in full. The General Fund still owes the Gifts & Memorial Fund \$8,800, which is required by Congregational action to be repaid on or before January 1, 2016. It is anticipated this will be accomplished using General Fund monies.

## **TREASURER'S RECOMMENDATIONS TO COUNCIL:**

(1) Move the \$1,039.05 Organ Fund into the Gifts & Memorials Fund. The origin and purpose of the organ fund is unknown but it is suspected it was started to purchase a new organ. In the last few years, about \$3,000 for organ repair has been made from the General Fund.

Seconded; To move the \$1,039.05 in the Organ Fund into the Gifts & Memorial Fund.

(2) Congregational members have expressed their desires that if money is left over from the air-conditioner fund it be moved to the Capital Improvement Fund (CIF). Initially, the \$30,773.50 gift was placed in the Gifts & Memorial Fund. Since the air-conditioner is to be paid with CIF, then the money needs to be moved.

Moved;

Seconded; To move \$30,773.50 from Gifts & Memorial into the Capital Improvement Fund.

Motion carried.

### **WEB SITE: [www.gracemuscatine.com](http://www.gracemuscatine.com)**

In 2013, there were approximately 62,000 hits to the Grace website from world-wide hackers and local interests seeking information. There has been no updates to the site in the last two years until recently when Kristy Cox assisted the current Parish Administrator in updating. The previous update process was complicated and time consuming; sometimes taking one hour to post an update.

The Council appointed web master, Mike Allenbaugh, added an ftp option and now the process is taking less than one minute. The web page is now current with updates and a hit counter has been added indicating daily usage. The hit counters are now recording about 16 hits per day. Keeping the web site updated is an on-going process and will require additional personnel to facilitate its needs. The current web page was written with Adobe Dreamweaver, but that is now obsolete. Better systems are now available and some are even free.

The Council, along with Mike Allenbaugh, are seeking graphic designers, web authors, programmers, and computer technicians to build, program, and maintain a new look for Grace's web site. If you are interested in being a part of this group, please contact Mike or any Council member.

### **PROPERTY BOARD:**

The exposed copper tubing around the new air-conditioner is vulnerable to theft by "scrapers." Also, there are valves very close to the Happy Time Preschool entrance, which could pose a personal injury. Therefore, the Property Board wants to install a fence around those areas before Happy Time starts preschool. Some of the other work associated with the fence will be undertaken by the Property Board to reduce the overall cost of the fence.

#### **TRY-A-TITHE SUNDAY – Stewardship focus**

As part of a year round stewardship program, this is an idea that came from the Rediscover Macedonia materials from the ELCA. Most of us know that a tithe is 10%, and that is what is referred to in the Bible in many different places as to what we should give. Many verses have an agricultural perspective, talking about giving of crops, which of course is not how we give today. But one of those really hits to the point of our faith, trusting the Lord by tithing:

“Bring the full tithe into the storehouse, so that there may be food in my house, and thus put me to the test, says the Lord of hosts: see if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you an overflowing of blessings.” Malachi 3:10

So this is an invitation to take one week during the month of May, and if you aren't already, tithe for one week. Hopefully this will be an easy thing to do as most of us know on any given week how much money we earned or received, or have to give. And giving this amount for one week hopefully doesn't cause the fear that pledging that amount for a whole year might: it is only human to fear not having enough money. “Try it, you'll like it!”
